We are very proud of our statutory outcomes this year which demonstrates pupils working above national standards across school (first release data):

100% phonics resit pass rate
93% reading (national 75%)
31% reading greater depth (national 25%)
89% writing (national 69%)
24% writing greater depth (national 15%)
90% maths (national 76%)
29% maths greater depth (National 26%)

Year 6

83% reading (national 73%)
37% reading higher score (national 28% 2018)
93% writing (national 78%)
32% writing greater depth (national 20% 2018)
96% Spelling, punctuation & grammar SPAG
(national 78%)
44% SPAG higher score (national 34% 2018)
90% maths (national 79%)
47% maths higher score (national 24% 2018)
